## Pastor's Letter

Tea Time

Advent is the season wherein we await the coming of Jesus Christ our Lord, reliving the past when Israel awaited the birth of the Messiah and embracing the future as we await Christ's second coming at the end of the age.

A British theologian once compared waiting for Christ to waiting for someone we have invited over for a late morning or early afternoon visit. He explains that if we wait *poorly*, we might sit in an easy chair, fretfully watch the clock and worry about whether or not the one who accepted our invitation will actually make an appearance. We then might start to wonder if we seem worthy of them visiting us at all. We might further imagine that if the invited visitor even *hesitates* to consider our worthiness of a visit, then maybe they were never worthy of the invitation in the first place. If we are subject to their judgement after having so kindly invited them into our home, then we should judge *them* before we are subject to *their* judgement. Lost in our own fretfulness, we could very easily put ourselves at odds with the one we thought favorable for an invitation before they ever approach our door.

Then again, if we wait properly for the one we invited over for a visit, perhaps we could spend some effort in appreciation for their visit even before they arrive. Maybe we went to the local bakery earlier or made some small batch of baked items or confections ourselves. And, of course, we could have the tea service ready to go in the room in which we expect to spend time visiting. Maybe a pot of coffee would be more appropriate, especially if the bakery purchase included donuts. In either case, we would probably make sure hot water for either service was maintained as such, ready to hand a steaming cup to our guest once we were seated. If we wanted to discuss other events in the

world, perhaps we would take time to read the daily news or listen to it on the radio. As these preparations are made with great expectations for the visit, perhaps we would keep an eye on the approach to the house that we might meet our guest in a timely fashion at the door to properly convey our interest, even our casual excitement, in their expected company.

How might we prepare for the return of our Lord and Savior, whom we not only expect to return, but who is watching how we prepare for his return. By faith we know that we have already been judged by our visitor as forgiven sinners chosen for everlasting life, even though we were sinners who had only prepared ourselves for eternal condemnation. We know that only his visitation makes us worthy. What might we do out of gratitude as we wait for him?

Maybe we should reinvite him into our lives through prayer and discipleship. Maybe we should do our best to understand his love by loving our neighbors as he first taught us. Maybe we should honor his Father by honoring him, knowing that such honoring can only be accomplished by telling and showing others how important he is to us *and* to them. Most importantly, let us not wait for "the Day of the Lord" fretfully and with great anxiety. Instead let us remain assured that Jesus has chosen us as his disciples and promises us eternal life, a promise which he enacted 2,000 years ago and which he maintains for us through his gift of faith to us in him.


