Pastor's Letter

Why Are We Singing That!?

Folks often make requests of me for particular worship music for particular seasons and occasions, and this I encourage. But many times, there are hymns more obscure that I choose for a particular Sunday to tip us out of our comfort zone just a bit. When I do this, musicality comes to mind, that of our musicians, that of our congregation, and even my own. If the tune is not only difficult but also uniquely obscure, I usually drop it. If the tune is catchy in any way, the lyrics will often grab my attention for delivering the gospel in a pointed way which my sermon (or that of a supply preacher) may not illuminate.

Hymns I chose for this Christmas season beyond the old, familiar carols included Of the Father's Love Begotten; Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming; and Cold December Flies Away. Musically and lyrically, they are simply beautiful. Theologically, and with great imagery, they point beyond the instance of the worldly birth of the only Son of God, Jesus Christ, to the purpose of his coming into the world and why his arrival points to the culmination of his earthly ministry for us-everlasting life with him beyond our lives in this world. Timeliness and context were the key for my clerical choice this year. If you hadn't noticed this year, many folks were completely done with saying "Happy Holidays" for fear of offending others, and most were greeting each other with "Merry Christmas". Even decorative symbolism in front yards was turning away from a secular Santa Claus and an over-televised green Grinch of mayhem and re-turning to the reason for the very name of the celebration, "Mass of Christ," "Nativity of our Lord," and "Christmas." Sometimes it is good to ride the pendulum swing back to group repentance as the whole body of Christ, and this was one, small way to participate.


